REGIONAL CLINICIAL CASE MANAGEMENT FOR YOUTH SUICIDE PREVENTION

Provided by BPA Health in collaboration with the Idaho Youth Suicide Prevention Program (IYSPP)

The Idaho Youth Suicide Prevention Program (IYSPP), formally known as the Idaho Lives Project has partnered with BPA Health to offer free statewide Regional Clinical Case Managers to assess, refer, and provide follow-up case management services to **youth up to age 24** who have attempted suicide or who have had treatment for serious thoughts of suicide. Case Managers are licensed behavioral health clinicians who provide the services listed below to advocate for and support youth as they reintegrate back into their families, schools, and communities.

- Follow-Up Support follow up with and act as a liaison among the youth/young adult, health facility/mental health providers, school, and family to provide continuity of care
- Assessment provide suicide risk assessments for youth who do not otherwise have access to assessment services due to barriers such as lack of insurance or Medicaid, or lack the financial resources to see a clinician, are geographically isolated, or encounter prohibitively long waiting lists for an assessment
- Peer-to-Peer Attempt Survivor Support Groups support groups for young adults aged 18 and over who have made previous suicide attempts

Referrals may come from school personnel, hospital discharge planners, or other applicable sources, and sources may be asked to assist in obtaining informed consents and releases of information from the parent/guardian and/or youth to enable the provision of case manager services.

Parents/Youth/Young adults may also call directly.
