11:40 AM – Update from DBH Sean Waldron 12:00 PM		Sean Waldron	The Idaho Behavioral Health Planning Council met for the Needs and Gaps reports, which are being compiled for the Governors Report for March.



			The Idaho Behavioral Health Council has reached out to the boards for support. The more collaboration the better between the entities the better. The process for attaining funds for the boards is out there. As soon as the board is full, we can connect to work on how to spend funds.
12:00 PM -	Strategic Planning	Brenda Willson,	 As a board we need to determine what we need to focus on for 2025. Top 3 action items from Gaps and Needs Report: Filling board – should get close to it. We want to continue to try to get our board full. Re-establish our presence in the community – will need to come up with a plan. Create collaborative partnerships with Region 4 – will need to come up with a plan. Issue: Residential treatment available for CMH Medicaid recipients. Discussion: Fran - Residential treatment is when a family does not feel they can provide treatment for the child. It's when a child goes to live in a treatment center. It's not something that most families can afford, and most youths get sent out of state. It's been a goal for Idaho for quite some time. Brenda – Not a lot of treatment centers in the state for Medicaid clients. Danielle – I work with teams focused on that. The bigger issue is most facilities don't accept CMH clients with Medicaid because reimbursement rates are too low.

	Solutions: Brenda – we need to think of ways in which we can share this Information, by educating legislators. Danielle – we need to work with Magellan as well. Sean – Magellan has a new panel where we can bring up issues like that. They encourage providers for input on a monthly basis. Sherry – Magellan is asking for provider input in Magellan Provider Advisory Committee or the Magellan Quality Improvement Committee, which are committees that help inform the IBHP system. Provider Advisory Committee - <u>IdahoProvider@MagellanHealth.com</u> and/or the Quality Improvement Committee: <u>dahoQualityDepartment@MagellanHealth.com</u> <u>assue: Stable Housing – Most state hospital discharges are</u> <u>discharged homeless</u> . Discussion: Shirley – stable housing is a hard one. We have houses that come and go. We do have good housing opportunities that are shared iving homes. When people are in shelters, they are less likely to follow through with PHP treatment. Fran – discharge planning role shifted to the state hospital with collaboration with Magellan. Solutions: Shirley - It would be great to get an apartment complex with reasonable rates, that would be ideal. Communication could and should be better with our state hospital.
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	Issue: Suicide prevention – no longer having screeners in schools.
	 Discussion: Sean - probably pertains to a bill that kids would have to get permission from parents for any mental health treatment. That bill limits school counselors from providing that level of care without getting permission from parents. Fran - Senate bill 1329. It also poses issues for youths using 988 and emergency services. https://www.acluidaho.org/en/parental-involvement-law-affecting-young-peoples-access-medical-care-senate-bill-1329-fact- sheet#:~:text=ln%202024%2C%20ldaho%20passed%20Senate.to% 20access%20most%20medical%20care. Emily - I was working as a school counselor, and prior to the senate bill we didn't have access to screeners either. It was considered crisis intervention. We were required to contact parents if there was a concern, in fact, we were required to contact parents with any change on mental status. Fran - I think this has been a long-term issue. Not assessing youth does not prevent suicide. Brenda - I might like more information to what research has showed that having a screener in the facility vs it being the next level. Fran - I would argue that with every step they have to take is more opportunities for it to fall through the cracks. Brenda - if the schools can't do it, what can we do to support? 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			Solutions: Brenda – there are opportunities for us to do outreach at booths. What grants can we ask for and funds that we can utilize to get this info out to the community? Sean - the Division of Behavioral Health created a process in July in which each of the boards that are supported by the division could have funding of up to \$15,000 a year. The process works by taking applications from the public and then requesting use of funds from the division. It's been approved through fiscal year 25 and I don't see it going away. After the board is filled up, I will work with you to go through that process.
