11:15 AM - 11:55 AM	Community presentation - ACT	Aaron Andreasen,	Aaron Andreasen I am the ACT team Lead for region 4, I work for Access BHS in Boise Idaho. My phone number is 2083384699 x113. Email is aaron@accessbhs.com . We started last year, and in within the last year we have started working with more than 40 clients. We go to the clients, we meet them in the community, at their homes or in the office, whatever is best for the client. We work with clients at least 3 times a week, we don't have a cap on the hours that we can work with clients. We make sure they are housed and keep their insurance going. ACT cannot take on more than 4 to 6 clients in a month, so it is a slow process. We work with people who are primarily going in and out of jail and state hospital a lot. Referrals come to me or our admin assistant. You can send an email or call one or both of us to send a referral. We get them on a list to do an assessment. When they are assessed, we are able to

			streamline them into services. If they don't qualify for ACT, we work to get them into CBRS services. We do have a waitlist that we are working through, nobody has been on it for longer than a week or two. Q&A: Brenda – what are your major needs and gaps you are seeing? Aaron – if they are on the ACT team, they are not able to engage in other services. The limitation is there are some people who don't have social security yet, and no forms of income, so they are not able to get Safe and Sober funding for housing. People have to choose housing or ACT because of the funding style. Brenda – are you seeing a way around that? Aaron – there is not much of a choice at the moment. Randal – Magellan does not pay for safe and sober unless they are in an outpatient program and ACT does not qualify for that. Fran – what if Magellan could issue an exception? Randal – we have tried. Aaron – we can work with people through state funding for non-insurance people, but there are limitations on what medication they can take. Sherry – the IBHP and Magellan team have met with the ACT providers regularly. These issues are being addressed in those meetings. Aaron – a lot of these issues are being worked on, but it is something we are running into.
