Over the last few months, members occasionally miss a meeting. Overall, attendance at Board meetings is good. Attendance expectations are outlined in the R4BHB Bylaws.

	ICADD Scholarships New member, beginning April 2021		Division of Health and Welfare (DHW) has applied for additional funding through SAMHSA. The Behavioral Health Boards may be able to access this money by applying for a grant through DHW. Every Behavioral Health Board would be eligible to apply, but there will likely not be funding available for every board. Idaho Conference on Alcohol and Drug Dependency (ICADD) will be virtual this year. During the BHB Leadership call, there was an ask for Behavioral Health Boards to consider providing scholarships. In the past, the R4BHB paid for scholarships or Division of Behavioral Health provided scholarships (but R4BHB had to find people). Previously, the R4BHB provided scholarships to applicants who resided outside of Ada County. This year, the registration fee is \$325. Jen Burlage suggested the R4BHB offer three (3) scholarships. Tami will add an action item on the meeting agenda for April. Advertising details will be discussed during the April Executive Committee meeting. Micah Crawford was appointed to the R4BHB, representing Department of Health and Welfare, beginning in April 2021.
3:05 – 3:20 PM	Youth Subcommittee Update	Mechelle Wilson, Youth Subcommittee Chair	Veronica Guerrera, YES Program Specialist, presented an update. January 5 th Committee meeting: 14 attendees. Presentation by Idaho Lives – This was an important resource to learn more about, especially as our child serving agencies shared about the mental health impact Covid has had on our youth.

 February 2nd Committee meeting: 17 attendees. The committee learned about the "Ticket to Dream Program" through Warm Springs, serving foster youth. This program provides both monetary assistance for foster youth to support them in paying for extracurricular activities, but also can provide clothing and other needed tangible items for foster youth. The CANS – Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths assessment tool will be the focus. State Hospital West (Mary Ball) is available to provide in-person tours of the new facility. If all certifications go smoothly, the new hospital could be taking adolescent patients by late April.
March 2 nd Committee meeting: 14 attendees. Pathways of Idaho presented information about the ESMI program. Optum of Idaho shared information about their annual conference coming in April. Laura Smith, CDH, provided an update on COVID. We are seeing a slight uptick in cases. Everyone is encouraged to remain vigilant on taking appropriate precautions. Businesses and individuals with questions are welcome to call the COVID Call Center with questions 208-321-222.

			Vaccine uptake across the state is going well. Providers have administered 80% of doses received. Central District Health (CDH) is receiving not quite 10,000 doses per week. We received Johnson&Johnson/Janssen vaccine last week (approximately 3,700 doses), but we are not expecting to receive additional shipment for a while as manufacturing ramps up.
			FMRI working to provide vaccine to the housing insecure population.
			Progression into Phase 3 for the state will begin Monday, March 15 th , with Group 3.1 (55-64 age with at least one medical condition). Vaccine rollout is expected to move through the subsequent groups each week.

			FMRI is currently targeting farm workers and people who work in food processing plants. If someone works in this industry, they can contact the clinic to schedule a vaccination time.
			FMRI has a mobile HIV testing van that travels around the area. It offers education around STI education, HIV
			education and offers HepC testing as well. Since one of our community health workers manages that, people are also screened for social determinants of health and matched with resources if needed.
			FMRI is outreaching to the Mexican Consulate to provide information, resources and health literacy.

			FMRI also provides patient navigation such as insurance registration during open enrollment and information on how to navigate the health care system.
