Recovery Month Nomination	Jen Burlage, Treasurer	Over the last few years, DBH has celebrated National Recovery Month in September. DBH is asking the regional behavioral health boards to nominate an individual for the Regional Empowerment Award, to recognize their work in the fight against opioids. Nominations are due by the August 15 <sup>th</sup> .
		Kim nominated, and Monica seconded to nominate Jenny Goebel for the award. Jenny started out at Phoenix, has done a lot of work at Boise High School with opioid addiction, and is tireless with providing recovery support services.

Partnership for Success Grant	Caroline Messerschmidt, CDH	Caroline provided an update on the Partnership for Success grant. The FY20 plan has been approved, and FY21 will be due in April so we can begin brainstorming projects and ideas for next year.  This year's activities include a life skills curriculum in Garden Valley. The Idaho After School Network will also be hosting a life skills program in Boise. Idaho City will get the activity bus again this year. This bus has been helpful for their students as transportation can be a barrier. Fremont Middle School in Kuna will have a two-day a week tutoring program that will include hands on activities. Caroline will also continue to distribute the Deterra packets that have already been purchased.  The "Be the Parents" campaign is being continued this year. ODP is targeting traditional TV and radio. Caroline has conversation card decks that have been successful. She stated she has thousands to distribute, and if anyone has any events or locations they could be useful for then they should contact Caroline. Caroline also has coffee sleeves that she will focus on distributing in the fall and winter when it is a little cooler.  Caroline has organized a drug impairment training for professionals. There was one training done at West Ada last year, and this year McCall and Mountain Home will receive the training. She will also continue to host the Strengthening Families training and will be partnering with the Idaho Federation of Families.
DBH Update	Jen Burlage, Treasurer	Jen reviewed the DBH Central Office Monthly update.
Budget Next Steps Discussion	Jen Burlage, Treasurer	The board's first four-year contract ended in April, and there is about \$14,000 in carryover funds that need to be spent. The board decided they would like to use this money to offer mini grants. The Region 7 BHB does something similar, and has a Grant Request Form that we can use as a template.  Action items:  • Kim and Sanda will review Region 7's Grant Request Form and edit the document to use as our application  • Carly will touch base with CDH's finance department to see if there are guidelines we will need to use.

They are working to collaborate with the Ada county jail to create a safe release program to pick up newly released inmates from jail so they don't have to walk or be picked up by someone from their previous environment.</li> <li>They are working to have a recovery coach in the Ada county jail</li> <li>The group is looking for representation from Elmore County. Brandi Hissong doesn't work in Elmore county anymore, but may know someone who does.</li> <li>The next meeting will be on August 20, 2019 at the PEER Wellness Center</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

City of Boise Continuum of Care	Maureen Brewer, City of Boise	Maureen Brewer from the City of Boise presented on Our Path Home (previously Continuum of Care). Our Path Home is a public-private partnershop to end homelessness in Ada County. They have four strategic initiatives which include to mature Our Path Home, end family homelessness, reduce first-time homelessness, and to evolve supportive housing.
